APPLICATION FOR TEMPORARY LICENSURE FOR CSR LICENSE (MILITARY SPOUSES/PARTNERS)

Business & Professions Code (BPC) sections 115.6, 135, 8007, 8020 and 8023, and California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Division 11 section 2420(a).

NOTICE

A temporary license issued by the Court Reporters Board of California (CRBC) is nonrenewable and shall expire 12 months after issuance, upon issuance or denial of a standard license, upon issuance or denial of a license by endorsement, or upon issuance or denial of an expedited license pursuant to BPC section 115.5.

Definitions: For the purposes of this application, the following definitions shall apply:

(1) "Disciplined" means that the applicant's license was placed on probation, revoked, suspended, reproved, censured, reprimanded, restricted, limited, or conditioned.

(2) "Jurisdiction" shall mean a California or another state's licensing board or agency, any agency of the federal government, or another country.

(3) "Disciplinary proceeding" shall mean any proceeding or investigation under the authority of the licensing jurisdiction pursuant to which a licensee may be disciplined.

NOTICES

MANDATORY DISCLOSURE OF SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS
